tion, we have been able to respond to the financial challenges of families by providing them with food baskets, diapers and connections to community resources they need, as well as providing them opportunities to build much-needed support networks with other families in similar situations. These help them to strengthen their resiliency throughout the many long emotional and financial challenges of life-threatening childhood illness."

This year, GCA's "Give Back to the Community" beneficiary will be the Institute of Human Services (IHS). "GCA presidents have the latitude to designate a nonprofit organization of their choice," Walthall says. Past beneficiaries include Child & Family Service in 2020 (\$103,350); Kaiser High School and Marine Corps Base Hawaii in 2019 (construction of "The Gathering Place" at Kaiser and the Marina Breezeway at MCBH); Carole Kai Charities-The Great Aloha Run and HomeAid Hawaii in 2018 (\$20,600); and IHS (\$31,250) and Kokua Hawaii Foundation (\$5,500) in 2017.

'The GCA's overall mission is to elevate Hawaii's construction industry and strengthen the foundation of our community," Walthall says. "We believe we accomplish this not only through built environments, but also by the way in which we support the community."
